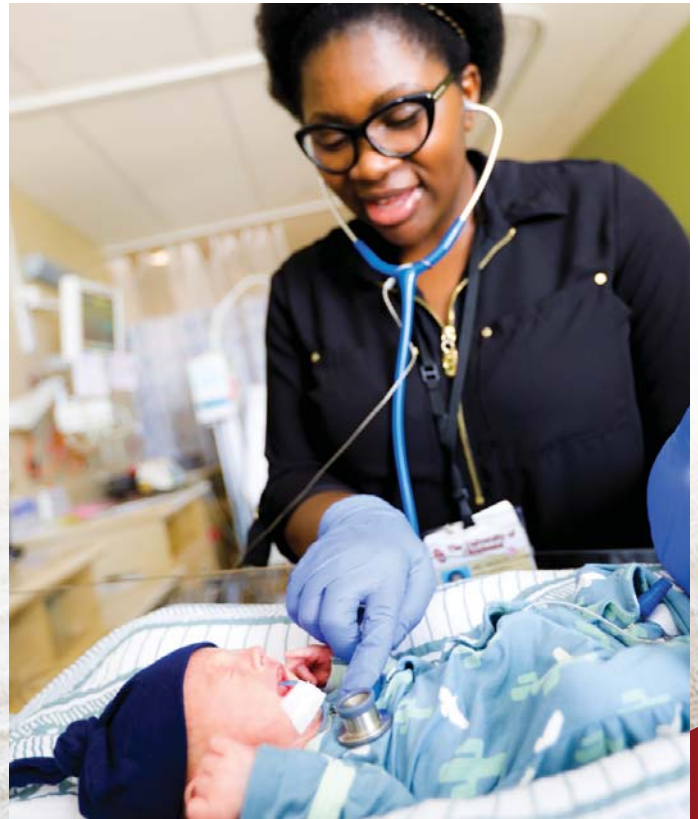

CONFERENCE OVERVIEW

The Neonatal Nurse Practitioners, Neoflight, and Physicians of the Section of Perinatal-Neonatal Medicine at OU Health Sciences Center have developed this conference to provide an educational opportunity for those involved in neonatal care. This conference is designed to enhance the knowledge, tools and skills of those that care for newborn and preterm infants.

Overall goal: Provide comprehensive, up-to-date, state-of-the-art medical, nursing, and respiratory education focused on optimal care for neonatal patients.

Overall objectives: At the end of the conference the participant will be able to:

- Identify whether noninvasive ventilation decreases the incidence of BPD in the neonate.
- Discuss the benefits of standardized feeding plans in the neonatal intensive care unit.
- Identify nosocomial infections in the NICU.
- List the uses of antibiotics in the neonate.
- Identify different neonatal diseases, management of care, and treatment options for critically ill newborns in an interactive game.
- Understand the use of critical congenital heart disease testing in the newborn.
- Discuss current hot topics in neonatal resuscitation.
- Discuss different neonatal scenarios and their outcomes presented in case presentations.
- Participate in active learning via poster presentations of recent clinical research and quality assurance projects addressing current medical, respiratory, and nursing management of high risk newborn infants.

CONTINUING EDUCATION CREDIT

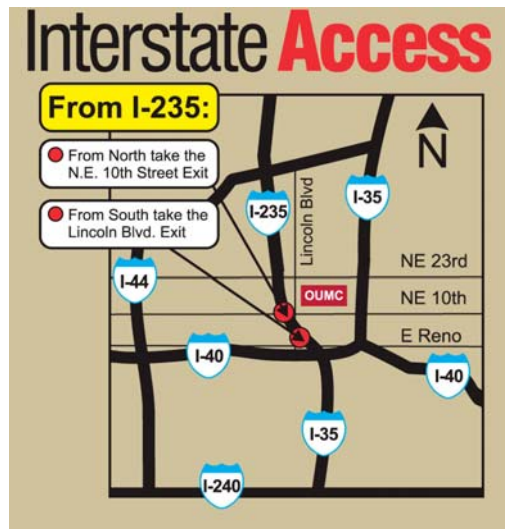
