The Preview Period began on August 5, 2025 and will end on September 3, 2025.

CMS encourages hospitals to review their HSRs and submit questions about their calculations as soon as possible. 



Trust your instincts. ALWAYS get medical care if you are not feeling well or have questions or concerns.

Tell 911 or your healthcare provider: “I had a baby on _____ I am having _____”

These post-birth warning signs can become life-threatening if you don't receive medical care:

- Pain in chest, obstructed breathing or shortness of breath (trouble catching your breath) may mean you have a blood clot in your lung or a heart problem
- Seizures may mean you have a condition called eclampsia
- Thoughts or feelings of wanting to hurt yourself or your baby may mean you have postpartum depression
- Bleeding (heavy), soaking more than one pad in an hour or passing an egg-sized clot or bigger may mean you have an obstetric hemorrhage
- Incision that is not healing, if episiotomy or C-section site
- Redness, swelling, warmth, or pain at the site may mean you have a blood clot
- Temperature of 100.4°F or higher may mean you have an infection
- Headache (very painful), vision changes, or dizziness may mean you have high blood pressure or preeclampsia


